

YOUR RIGHTS

- ▶ To apply for services
- ▶ A determination of your eligibility for services within 60 days
- ▶ An explanation of the process and how decisions are made
- ▶ Participation in assessments and in the development of your Individualized Plan for Employment (IPE)
- ▶ A written copy of your IPE that includes all agreed upon services
- ▶ Review of your IPE once a year
- ▶ A written decision of any service that is denied
- ▶ To appeal decisions you disagree with and to continue services during the appeal period
- ▶ Mediation of disagreements if you've requested an appeal
